

JPCOMING CHANGES TO THE TRADITIONAL SUMMER EVENT CALENDAR IN SKRAEL

There are some important changes on the way for several events that have become staples of the Skraeling Althing summer events calendar.

Two long-standing events are being combined this year at a new location, and a recent addition is changing venues to be able to add even more activities.

In June, Summer Siege will once again be held on June 25th, but will be moving to a bigger location.

The first two years, Summer Siege was held at Grant Mor Farm near Cornwall. This year, based on comments received, the event is moving to the Chesterville Fair Grounds.

The event will still have its traditional hay bale castle and equestrian demo, along with a full slate of activities (both martial and non). The new venue will add to this tradition by providing better parking, an indoor facility for bad weather (with indoor bathrooms), and a feast hall.



SOCIETY NEWS ABOUT KINGDOM NEWSLETTERS

Changes are on the way to how Ealdormere's Tidings is produced and distributed.

As a result of significant budget challenges at the Society level, the Board of Directors announced several changes earlier this year.

One of the major changes is that the funds transferred to the various Kingdoms to produce and mail-out hard copies of their newsletters will be reduced by 60 per cent as of April 2011.

In order to adjust to this new level of funding, the Board is also planning to make changes to the rules around Newsletters.

These changes will affect the requirements for both what needs to be included in Kingdom newsletters, as well as how they should be distributed.

This includes a plan to transition to electronic newsletters by January 1st, 2012.

A question and answer session was held at Valentine's Day Massacre in February with Viscountess Kaellyn mac Dermott, one of the Directors on the Board.

She explained that the stipends provided to the Kingdoms for newsletters represent well over 50% of the total membership income generated by the Society.

According to Viscountess Kaellyn, once the current financial situation is addressed, further adjustments will be made to the membership fees.

The plan is to reduce the cost of membership down the road for those receiving electronic newsletters to reflect the reduced cost of production and distribution.

She also indicated that printed newsletters would likely still be available at a membership cost appropriate to the higher production costs.

What this means is that over the next year you will likely see some changes to the Tidings.

According to Lord Gunther Wahl-

stadt von Bremen, Ealdormere's Chronicler, the changes could actually lead to more articles and content in the Tidings.

He reasons that an electronic version would not be limited in length based on printing and shipping costs.

The Kingdom Privy Council is still determining what the impact will be, and how best to adjust the production of the Tidings to continue to serve the membership in Ealdormere.

More information will be shared in the near future.

Baronial Council Meeting Notes

Here are some notes on the most recent Baronial Council meetings:

Feast of the Hare

Lord Dragul Maksimov Vodnikov stepped down as Baronial Seneschal and Lady Constance of Caldrithig was named the new Seneschal.

Aurik Burnsson was also voted in as the new Baronial Web Minister, replacing Elrik the Bastard.

The Barony has found a craftsman to make new Baronial thrones for significantly less than originally budgeted. (Note: The thrones are now completed and are in use by Their Excellencies)

Practicum

Skraeling Althing is on the bid rotation to host Kingdom A&S this November. As well, the next Baronial 12th Night is on rotation for Harrowgate Heath.

Autocrat's Day off and Baronial Muster are merging into a single Baronial camping event at Raven's Knoll. Bids will be voted on at Break the Back of Winter.

Both the Baronial Exchequer and Chatelaine position are coming available. Applications for the Exchequer were due March 31st, and for the Chatelaine by July 8th.

Lord Duncan is proposing the Bar-

ony construct some loaner war doors for Skrael fighters. More to come as the proposal is developed.

Following the meeting, the Seneschals met to go over the member lists from each Canton to reduce duplication. They are also asking that anyone changing Cantons within the Barony notify the Seneschals from both groups so that they can update the lists regularly.

Avelyn's Book Nook

"Britain in the Middle Ages: An Archaeological History"

Written by Francis Pryor

For those of us who love exploring the dirty details of archaeological evidence from the comfort of our easy chairs, this will be a book for you.

Early into this book it is quite apparent that the author is an accomplished archaeologist and very much in-tune with the small but significant details that can be unravelled from a good dig.

Overall, I think I learned as much about the mechanics and aims of a modern dig as I did about the era and the island.

Pryor is clearly trying to paint a different picture of household British life in the "dark ages" than that which modern media generally portrays, and he succeeds.

This book studies 900 years of English history, covering some major sub-topics including: the difference between "wet" and "dry" digs, construction and carpentry techniques, the evolution of population dispersal in both rural and urban settings, the effects of the plague on social and industrial levels, farming techniques, and many others.

I found it to be a slow, weedy read in the first half or so of the book—yet intrigued enough to continue.

I was easily distracted by the author's direct narrations to the reader; often including tirades and criticisms of different archaeological approaches.

However, I can say the book did pick up momentum quite nicely throughout the middle and near the end of the book as I became accustomed to Pryor's authorial idiosyncrasies.


Despite these few shortcomings, I was delighted by the numerous "aha!!!" moments I had throughout, where Pryor's conclusions were very enlightening.

This is one of those reference books where I found myself with pencil in hand on many occasions underlining (gasp!) some really neat tidbits of info that would surface as the cream of the discussion. It's now fully dog-eared as well.

All in all, it was a thoroughly straight-forward non-fiction, with good insight despite the sometimes serpentine analysis provided by the author.

It's not what I would consider a light read, or an "overview" oriented reference.

But, if you're in the mood for a

good saturation of details on some very specific topic areas, I do recommend giving this one a look over. (<u>HarperCollins</u>, 2007)
