Greetings dear Skraels! I come bearing some news, and some requests.

Firstly, currently only Harrowgate Heath has an active canton Pursuivant. While it is not required for cantons to have local heralds, it's very helpful to the local members who may prefer to work with a herald in person, and in many ways having a local herald can encourage a group to be more enthusiastic about heraldry, and to help bring pageantry to the group. The term of office is generally two years. If you are interested in being a canton Pursuivant, please apply to your seneschal. As a canton Pursuivant, your duties would be to:

help the canton and its populace further their heraldic interests

report the heraldic activities of the canton to the baronial Pursuivant once a quarter

A canton Pursuivant must:

be a current paid member of the SCA and hold a membership throughout their term of office

be 15 years of age or older (minors must obtain written permission from their parent or legal guardian)

Secondly, some happy news.

Some of you know of the difficulty the barony has had in the last 10 years since Laurel Sovereign of Arms issued an erratum returning the barony's name from the commonly used "Barony of Skraeling Althing" to the very first reference of the barony in 1979, "Barony of the Scraeling Althing". It has been a confusing process to try to figure out what happened, because we don't have any paperwork from back then, but everyone both in kingdom and on the Laurel staff has been extremely helpful and understanding. Mistress Cainder, as Trillium Principal Herald, and my predecessor, Lord Nathaniel, had made great strides to try to get it resolved.

Laurel staff has expressed that they're happy to issue an erratum officially correcting our registered name to "Barony of Skraeling Althing", as everyone had known it for many years. Since we wish to avoid this kind of situation in the future, we have only one last step to make sure that all possible paperwork to support this erratum is properly obtained and filed. To achieve this, we need to poll the populace to show evidence that "Barony of Skraeling Althing" is the name the people want, and a petition of signatures by members to seal the deal.

Any person of the populace who holds a current Sustaining, International, Associate, or Family membership in the SCA may sign the petition and participate in the poll. Non-members may participate in the poll as your response would be valuable to help get a pulse of the populace, but these votes will not have an effect on the poll results.

If you wish to change your answer, you will be presented with an Edit link after a response is submitted. If you have any difficulties, please don't hesitate to contact me for help.

The petition will be available at Trillium War for folks to sign. I will also distribute petition sheets to canton seneschals to bring around to local meetings and practices. Please endeavour to make it out to one of these to help sign the petition! I hope to close this off in the next 30 days to send it up as quickly as possible.

Dear Gentles all,
