Alienors' A & S Adventures: A Submission by Fiona Stewart.

Over the next year, I will be working on a White Wolf Fian challenge. The White Wolf Fian is an A&S challenge order in Ealdormere, which encourages artisans to take on projects which are a personal challenge to the challenger, and which increase their knowledge and skills. Pure research projects are not allowed – challenges should include producing an item (or group of related items). Challenges typically take six to twelve months, though extensions are allowed.

My challenge was to run some experiments on a variety of modern and reproduction spindles, to test what kind of yarn they are best for making and how efficient they are. This is mostly a research project, but as per the challenge guidelines, I will be producing a group of related items – a big pile of sample skeins of yarn. My study will be based on a similar study by Karina Gromer [1]. I'll be making a few changes from the original study:

The original study used real extant whorls from the Hallstatt salt mine. Not having access to real extant whorls, I'll be using handmade soapstone whorls of three different weights. I'm also going to compare results from three modern spindles; a disc-shaped whorl, a rim-weighted whorl, and a Turkish spindle.

I'll be comparing empty spindles to a spindle with 50 g of yarn on it already.

In the original study, Gromer tried making different thicknesses of yarn with each spindle. I will be making one thickness of yarn with each spindle – whatever thickness comes most naturally.

The original study assessed suspended and supported spinning. I will also be experimenting with holding the spindle in my hand and twirling it with my fingers, a technique that is shown in lots of illuminations.

To make sure that the results aren't too biased by my own habits, I'm collecting samples of yarn produced by other spinners.

So far, I've completed the experiments for one spindle (the medium-weight soapstone one), and collected samples from three other spinners. I've already noticed differences between supported and suspended use, and between how it behaves empty to how it behaves full. Watch this space over the next year for articles describing my findings. If you'd like to contribute spinning samples, find me or my display at an event, and if you have an idea for a challenge of your own, feel free to talk to any Fian member.
